## DRAFT MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF SUDBROOKE PC HELD ON THURSDAY 7 SEPTEMBER IN THE VILLAGE HALL

PRESENT: Councillors Mrs Tracey Bowman (Chair), Mrs Sandra Clayton, Paul Fido, Mrs Pauline Loven, Dave Scott, District Councillor Baptiste Velan, Christine Myers (Clerk), Bridget Solly (Treasurer)

### 1 ■ PARISHIONERS ITEMS

- ▶ A resident had written to the Council stating that the multi-purpose sports area would benefit from a tennis net. A response had been made advising that the net had sadly had to be removed due to vandalism.
- ▶ It was suggested that the cost of the provision of basketball nets on the multi-purpose sports area be sought. Clerk to source.
- ▶ Concern from a resident about the increase of traffic on West Drive and that the highway and footpath, promised by the developers of The Parklands, had still not been constructed. That the Clerk write to the Project Manager of The Parklands unanimously Resolved.
- ▶ That a hedge was overhanging the footway on St Edward's Drive. The Clerk was asked to write a polite letter to the owner of the property.
- ▶ A report had been made that a resident had fallen on the uneven footpath near to the bear in the woods. The Clerk was asked to make the Project Manager of The Parklands aware.

### 5 ■ REPORTS ON MATTERS OUTSTANDING

- ▶ A) Burial space/new cemetery – Nothing further to report.
- ▶ B) Grass encroachment/upgrading of path to cycleway, Wragby Road – Awaiting response from CC Sue Rawlins.
- ▶ C) Scothern Lane – Report re speeding survey by Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership – if received – Parish Council had been notified that difficulties had been encountered with equipment, but it was on the list for surveying.
- ▶ D) Policy for parking on verges – received from County Councillor Sue Rawlins – Response from LCC Highways as follows....

## 5 ■ REPORTS ON MATTERS OUTSTANDING cont...

"We don't have any powers to enforce against this kind of parking and as below the police are unlikely to respond unless there is a significant anti-social behaviour or an obvious safety issue, obstruction and damage to the verges is unlikely to cause them to act.

"We can repair the damage to the ruts through simple measures like topsoiling and seeding.

"If it's creating a significant safety issue, then we can look at things more closely but unfortunately this is something that happens en masse across the County. Local messaging tends to be the most positive in getting people to park more conscientiously."

► E) Reply to Chairman's letter from Marc Jones, Police and Crime Commissioner – A reply sought permission from the PCCC to pass on the Council's concerns to the Chief Constable's Office.

► F) Cutting back of overhanging shrubs in village – response to letters/verbal communication – Those residents requested to cut back their shrubs/hedges had done so.

► G) Section 106 Agreement, Church Lane – update from County and District Councillors - DC Baptiste Velan said he would pursue this on behalf of the Parish Council.

► H) Grounds maintenance in village – Report by Councillor Paul Fido – Cllr Fido and the Clerk had toured the village and identified areas which required additional maintenance, some of this to be included within the next years Grounds maintenance contract. Cllr Fido stated that he had marked out the Wild flower area to enable the surrounding ground to be cut as

normal. The trees in Northfield Avenue had been cut back.

► I) Request for pedestrian crossing on A158 – reply from CC Sue Rawlins – No reply received.

## 6 ■ TO CONSIDER THE DRAINAGE PROBLEM IN THE VILLAGE HALL CAR PARK

However, it being obviously important to the Highways Department, it was suggested that the email be circulated to residents in the event that someone local may be more qualified to carry out this request.

## HARDY GARDENERS ENJOY SOME FOTHERBY VALUE

► On Sunday 17 September, a smaller group of members attended Woodlands Peppin Lane, Fotherby, Louth, on a less than perfect day, which had opened up as part of the National Gardens Scheme.

There were eight of us and the day was dull and grey at the start and it began raining on the way home. The garden is well named, fairly small, oddly shaped and consists of a number of large mature trees under-planted with a very wide range of plants, from small to large shrubs to tiny bulbs.

A narrow path mainly of wood chips intertwines through the garden. What a garden this is; it is expected that by late September it is the end of the season and the gardens are looking tired and well past their best.

Not in this garden, there was a wide range of shrubs in flower, some having just started flowering and lots of them we had never seen before. A repeating feature through the garden hardy were Cyclamen just coming into flower.



There were some Fuschias still in flower and several asters doing well. All in all a very different garden full of plants that could be described as being just right for those difficult spaces, in the shade, damp shade, dry shade, deep shade and partial shade and many plants for late season colour.

The garden has a large nursery area where the plants were available to buy at reasonable prices.

One of the owners is an artist and has a studio and exhibition room in the garden with examples of his work for sale. Finally there was a refreshment area with tea or coffee and a slice of cake for three pounds, what value.

## HARVEST TIME, WHEN WE ALL SHOULD REJOICE

► Oh, how I wish I could go through life without any worries. "Do not worry", Jesus says. But we are worried about many things: our families, our friends, our church, the world, our life, our death.

We don't often worry about what we shall eat or drink or wear, though, do we – because we have enough or do we? In reality, there are people in our parishes and villages who don't have enough. There are people in our country who don't have enough. And there are certainly people in many places all over the world who do not have enough – to eat, to drink or to wear.

October sees the end of the season of Creation in the Church calendar. The past few weeks have been awash with produce shows, harvest suppers, harvest festivals, scarecrow shows and open gardens!

Creation-tide is the perfect time to give thanks, as we see the local farmers putting in gruelling hours to bring in the harvest we are reminded of the beauty of the natural world, and of its fragility.

Traditionally harvest time sees the church giving thanks to God for his blessings and for the successful harvest being brought in, it is a time of rejoicing and gratitude. So often though, especially as we become increasingly

detached from our food story it's easy to forget the humans involved in the process. From farmers to transporters, to shop assistant and those who prepare our meals, each playing their part and we have much to be thankful for.
