## VICAR'S LETTER

Spirituality is an important part of our faith, even though in our materialistic and activity-based age it has too often been marginalised – even by the Church. Sometimes we need to **be** rather than to **do**. A quick look at what people are seeking today in the Western world reveals a widespread hunger for spirituality – not confined to traditional religious people. The current search ranges from the practices of cultures other than our own to Eastern religions - even the Kabbalah. It is too easily forgotten that over two thousand years Christianity, Eastern and Western, has provided a vast amount of spirituality and mysticism.

Our prayer life forms part of our Spirituality. One place this can be exercised in the parish is in the Prayer Hour held once a month at 36 Scothern Lane at 10.30 a.m. Generally on the last Tuesday of a month, forthcoming dates are 26<sup>th</sup> February, 25<sup>th</sup> March, 29<sup>th</sup> April, 27<sup>th</sup> May, and 24<sup>th</sup> June.

### **95 PARISHIONERS ITEMS**

A complaint had been received from a resident stating that the adverts in Sudbrooke News were too large. It was felt by members that reducing the size of the adverts would make some illegible, resulting in less advertisers.

It was reported that the rainwater drains in Holme Drive were not clearing quickly after rainfall. This would be reported to the Highways Department.

The nameplates depicting 'Sudbrooke' on entering the village from Scothern and Nettleham were reported as missing. Replacements would be requested.

The Clerk was asked to write a letter of thanks to Leo Truscott for undertaking the staining of the seats within the village as part of his Duke of Edinburgh Award.

Cllr D Ordish requested clarification that it had been recorded that he left the meeting of the Parish Council held on 1st February 2007 whilst a

planning application was discussed regarding siting of a mobile home in Woodland Way, Sudbrooke Park. The Clerk confirmed that this was recorded and minute 141C) refers at the meeting of the Parish Council held on 1st February 2007.

The Chairman reported that County Councillor R Hiscox had obtained the cost of the length of footway constructed near to Bransby, Sturton By Stow as £32,000.

### **96 DISTRICT COUNCILLORS REPORT**

DC S Curtis reported that the planning application for Red Barn Farm, Scothern for re-instatement of a poultry unit had been granted with four routes to and from the site to be used by drivers.

### **97 POLICE MATTERS**

Reports of break-ins to parked vehicles were currently being reported.

### **98 NOTES OF MEETING HELD ON 1ST NOVEMBER 2007**

These were signed as a correct record.

### **99 REPORTS ON MATTERS OUTSTANDING**

a) Parish Plan and Action Plan – update – Councillor Halliday said that the Parish Plan Group meeting scheduled for 11th December had been cancelled due to the unavailability of many members. A revised meeting date was proposed for 15th January (subsequently rearranged to 22nd January in the

village hall at 7-30pm).

Clr. Halliday had spoken to Alan Brown, Principal Highways Officer, on 5th December about the outstanding reply to the letter of 17th October from Cllr Halliday about the Wragby Road traffic lights. Mr. Brown stated that a full reply would be sent in the following 2 weeks but it should be noted that the entitlement criteria were due to change next Spring to include more variables and Sudbrooke should check its data against the new criteria.

b) Christmas Tree event:-

i) Report – The weather on 2nd December had been disappointing so the event had had to be held in the Village Hall but it had been successful. The Treasurer estimated the cost of the event to be £250.00.

The Beever Band had played splendidly and it was proposed and seconded that a donation of £50 be made to the Band with a request that they play at next years event.

ii) Purchase of Marquee – At this point in the meeting (time 8.00pm) Councillor J Adams declared a personal interest in this item (marital status), left the meeting for the entire discussion and returned to the room when summoned at 8.06 pm.

The Chairman informed Councillors that Mrs Jenny Adams had offered the Parish Council a marquee which she was selling at £150.00. Councillors were referred to Minute 28 of the meeting of 1 June 2006 when purchase of a marquee had been

discussed.

Members felt that a marquee owned by the Parish Council would be very useful for village events and it could be stored in the Village Hall.

Resolved unanimously: That the marquee be purchased from Mrs Adams at a cost of £150.00.

c) Potholes – entrance to Paddock – It was understood that these had been repaired.

d) Railings near to stream, Scothern Lane – These were still awaiting repair by the Highways Department.

### **100 SPORTSFIELD COMMITTEE**

The Council resolved to move into closed session at the end of the meeting to discuss this item. The public would be asked to leave the meeting at that stage.

### **101 CONSERVATION**

Councillor I Russell informed the meeting that the free trees from the County Council were awaiting collection. These would be planted on the area of land at the end of Beresford Drive.

### **102 BUS SHELTERS**

a) Request by Lincolnshire County Council for Parish Council to clean bus shelters – A request had been made by the County Council that the Parish Council enter into an agreement to clean and maintain the two bus shelters owned by the County Council and situated on Wragby Road,

Sudbrooke.

Members had all been copied the agreement and following in-depth discussion when it was felt that sweeping/cleaning of the bus shelters could be incorporated into the Village Spring Clean, the Parish Council resolved not to enter into the Agreement with the County Council.

b) Request for lighting of bus stop, near to Cherry Tree Café, Wragby Road – A request had been received from a resident for the provision of lighting for the bus stop near to the Cherry Tree Café. Members agreed that lighting was required in this location for the safety of residents and agreed to pursue the matter with the County Council.

### **103 SUDBROOKE NEWS**

It was noted that the magazine had been published early this month in order to publicise the Christmas Tree event and the Editor would be thanked for his efforts.

### **104 FINANCE**

- a) Approval of grass cutting contract for 2008 cutting season – Members agreed unanimously to continue with the contract with Serviceteam.
- b) Audit 2006/7 – This had been approved by Moore Stephens, Auditors for Parish Councils.
- c) Precept 2008/9 – The budget was discussed and agreed as follows:-

RESOLVED : That Sudbrooke Parish Council precept £16,500 for the financial year 2008/9.  
The following was also noted in the Parish Precept letter from WLDC - 'As the current parish subsidy arrangements have been in operation for a number of years, the Council (West Lindsey District) will be looking to review the arrangements during the next calendar year. For 2008/9 the basis of the subsidy calculation will continue as now, but subject to the outcome of the review, there may be changes in the subsidy arrangements for 2009/10 onwards. Further information for discussion with parishes will be provided during 2008/9.

It was agreed that the Financial Services Manager at West Lindsey District Council could possibly be

invited to address the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council.

### **105 PLANNING**

a) Applications:-

i) 15 Ellison Close – 121273 – extension – no objections.

ii) Red Barn Farm, Langworth Road, Scothern – Application for replacement of existing 20 obsolete poultry houses and feed bins with 9 new poultry houses, 14 feed bins and additional propane gas cylinders – consideration of vehicular access – Comments:- ‘ There is extreme concern about the access to and from the site. The access which concerns Sudbrooke would direct the traffic past the school in Scothern, along Sudbrooke Road/ Scothern Lane and onto a very busy junction at the entrance to the A158 from Sudbrooke. There is currently a 20mph zone around the school which is obviously a very busy area.

There are also two bridges with the stream running underneath. Has a weight exercise been carried out on these bridges in order to establish that they are able to take the additional weight from the heavy lorries which would cross them?’

b) Permission – 8 Park Close – extension – 120901

c) Refusals of planning permission:-

75 Wragby Road – alterations to property – 120992  
Park Farm, Main Drive – erection of dwelling in connection with agriculture – 120999

### **106 CHAIRMANS COMMENTS**

a) Bus route – It was noted that the Parish Council were still awaiting a reply to correspondence regarding continuance of the PC Coach route from Nettleham through Sudbrooke. The Clerk would contact PC Coaches regarding this matter.

b) Parish Council Election - The Chairman drew to the attention of the meeting that the Parish Council would be due for re-election in May 2008. The Clerk was asked to place an article in Sudbrooke News regarding this with a view to attracting parishioners interest.

### **107 CORRESPONDENCE**

a) Footbridge over drain in Sudbrooke Park – Notification from LCC that a new footbridge would be constructed due to the current bridge being constantly vandalized.

b) Flooding - Letter from Langworth Group Parish Council requesting that as Sudbrooke, Langworth and Nettleham, share a ‘Beck’ each Parish Council work in conjunction with Langworth’s Volunteer Flood Wardens in the pursuance of flood alleviation. It was also drawn to the attention of the Council that a development in Wolsey Way, Lincoln for 370+ homes would direct the surface water into Nettleham beck, continuing to Sudbrooke and on to Langworth. It was suggested that County Councillor Roger Hiscox be asked to become involved and also Mr Charles Ireland as a member of the Witham Third Internal Drainage Board.

c) After School Kids Club – The Clerk had been approached by Childrens Links regarding the possibility of running an After School Club in the Village Hall. The Clerk was asked to correspond with Childrens Links and notify them that such a Club already was running in Scothern and that another Club in Sudbrooke may not be viable.

a meeting with Nettleham Parish Council to be held on 9th January 2008 in the Sports Pavilion, Nettleham commencing at 7.30pm to discuss the possibility of a cycleway between the two villages. All members expressed an interest to attend the meeting.

## **SUDBROOKE PARISH PLAN**

The print deadline meant that a report of the Parish Plan Group meeting on 22<sup>nd</sup> of January would miss the February issue and should appear in the March issue of Sudbrooke News. One of the topics for discussion by the Group concerns the content of an extraordinary meeting held by Nettleham Parish Council on 9<sup>th</sup> January 2008. My notes of that meeting follow and are published to Sudbrooke residents solely for information at this stage.

Nettleham Parish Council had called an extraordinary meeting on 9<sup>th</sup> January 2008 to hear proposals from Truelove Ltd for the future development of Nettleham. The meeting was open to the public and Sudbrooke Parish Council had been invited to attend.

Councillors Adams, Ordish, Rignall and Halliday attended the meeting. Paul Truelove and Ian Orme (architect) represented Truelove Ltd.

The proposals from Truelove Ltd addressed many of the requirements from parishioners contained in Nettleham's Parish Plan.

These included:

- Developing new footpaths and bridleways around the whole of Nettleham parish.

- Building a new medical centre.
- Building a new village hall.
- Building a mix of houses to include needs of the elderly and affordable housing.
- Enhancing sports facilities.

Priority would be given to the medical centre and housing needs of the elderly. Thereafter it was anticipated that approx. 15 properties per annum be built over the 40 years lifespan of the proposal.

The general reaction to the proposal was favourable so Nettleham Parish Council resolved to have more detailed discussions with Truelove Ltd.

### **Impacts on Sudbrooke**

An easy one to start with; included in the footpath scheme would be a new footpath down Sudbrooke Lane between Sudbrooke and Nettleham. This would meet a priority requirement in Sudbrooke's Parish Plan.

The next impact is more problematical concerning the new medical centre. The proposal is to locate the new centre in Greetwell Lane which is on the western edge of Nettleham.'

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# **PARISH COUNCIL REPORT**

## **REPORT OF PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 3<sup>RD</sup> JANUARY 2008 IN THE VILLAGE HALL.**

All members of the Council were present, along with the Clerk, Treasurer and 2 members of the public.

**Bus Shelter lighting** – The Parish Council are continuing to pursue the possibility of lighting in the area of the bus shelter near to the Cherry Tree Café.

**Drainage, Holme Drive** – Members were disappointed that there had been no response to a request to the Highways Department of the County Council to clear the offlets/gullies on Holme Drive which were blocked. The Clerk was asked to write to the County Council to ascertain whose responsibility it would be if there should be a flooding problem in the area when they had not responded to a report of a problem.

**Tennis Net Prices** would be sought so that the Court would be operational for the tennis season.

**Planning application** – Erection of a garage, land adjacent to 'Wayside', West Drive – It was noted by members that this proposal was not 'adjacent' but 'opposite'. Objections would be made to the District Council due to the height of the garage, it being disproportionate to its purpose and it also being obtrusive to surrounding properties.

**Election of Council** – This would take place in May of this year and it is likely that there will be vacancies. *Any parishioner wanting more information on becoming a member of the Parish Council please contact the Clerk.*

**Date of next meeting – 7<sup>th</sup> February 2008 – Village Hall, 7.30pm – All residents very welcome to come along.**

Welcome to this month's Edition of Police News. I would like to start by saying a big thank you to PCSO Jackie Parker and PC Diamond for holding the fort for me whilst I've been away. I've heard nothing but good things about the help they've been giving everyone, and its nice to know you've all been in good hands.

Unfortunately my first newsletter for some time isn't good news. We have seen, over the area covered by Nettleham police station, an increase in vehicle crime lately. It is mainly theft from cars, etc, with one or two being actually stolen. It's difficult to tell at this stage why this is happening, but we are working on ways to combat this current problem with the intention of resolving it in the short and long term. In the meantime I would like to enlist your help. Apart from the usual request to report anyone or anything suspicious, I need to ask you all to take a look at your own vehicles and ensure they do not become a target for thieves. Incredibly we still have people who are leaving valuables in their cars in full sight of anyone who cares to look in. We are aware of people who are leaving coats, bags, laptops, cash, and even Sat

Nav's in full sight, sometimes overnight, for people to steal. I can appreciate how embarrassing it must be for someone to ring about a theft from a car when they've left the item on full display!! Help us by helping yourselves, and clear everything from view. Don't leave that jacket in there because you might forget to pick it up tomorrow, and don't leave that Sat Nav on display because you need it again first thing in the morning! If you can see it, then so can they. Please put everything away and out of sight, and hopefully together we prevent you from becoming another statistic. If anyone needs advice on Crime Prevention don't hesitate to get in touch.

Is there anyone in the area who has not joined our Crime Information scheme yet? There is unlimited room for everyone, and all we need is your name, the village you live in, and your email address. We will then add you to the list, and send you a confirmation email. The scheme aims to bring to your attention crime within your area as soon as possible so you can take steps with your own security if necessary, but also for us to pass on advice and appeals for help. This is a

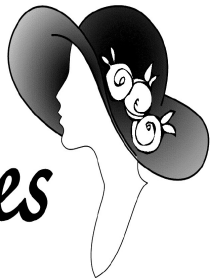

## **BIRD ATLAS 2007 – 2011: THE BIRDS IN OUR AREA**

(Welton, Dunholme, Scothern, Riseholme, Nettleham & Sudbrooke)

During the next four years volunteers in England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales will be forwarding records of the birds seen in every 10 km x 10 km square in the four countries. That information will be fed back to the British Trust for Ornithology (BTO) regularly and at the end of the four year period a new Bird Atlas will be produced, with maps and relevant details for each species. More details can be found on the BTO web site at [www.birdatlas.net](http://www.birdatlas.net).

There are two main ways of collecting the data. First, by inviting anyone, like you, to submit records at any time by means of a form called *Roving Records (RRs)*. The second method is by nominating specific observers to areas measuring 2km x 2km (known as *tetrads*) and those observers will carry out four x two-hour surveys in their *tetrads* each year. Those specific two-hour surveys will be called *Timed Tetrad Visits (TTVs)*. There will be an early winter (Nov / Dec) and a late winter (Jan / Feb) *TTV*, as well as an early spring (Mar / Apr) and a late spring (May / Jun) *TTV* each year.

Peter Montgomery has been allocated ten *tetrads* for *TTVs* in the area just north of Lincoln. Those ten squares cover most of the area to the north of the Lincoln bypass, and lying between the A15 and the A158. The main villages in that area are Welton, Dunholme, Scothern, Riseholme, Nettleham and Sudbrooke. During the early winter *TTV* survey in Nov / Dec 2007 fifty different species of birds were identified in our area. We know that there are more species out there that have not yet been recorded; hopefully they will be found in Jan / Feb.

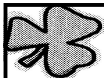
**Thorpe-on-the-Hill 0 - 10 Ellison
