October is the month of Harvest Services – Sudbrooke Family Service at 10.30 a.m. on the 11th, and Harvest Evensong at Langworth at 6.00 p.m. on the 18th (followed by the Harvest Supper in the Memorial Hall : tickets for this are available, and if you have trouble getting hold of one do please phone my wife Anne on 01522 – 754233).

October 2010 will be the month for a Sudbrooke Flower Festival. The dates to put in your diary now are the 8th,9th and 10th. Eleanor Clarke will be releasing more information over the coming months and will be looking for help from various volunteers. When I last looked she had a list of some 15 jobs associated with the event – and many do not include arranging the flowers ! Hopefully we can make this a real community event and if you would like to know more, at this stage, do please contact Eleanor on 01522 – 753119.

October is a good month for celebrating what are called the "Lesser Saints", including our traditional church Patron Saint - St. Edward the Confessor (13^{th} October). Others that are celebrated before him include :-

October 4^{th} - Francis of Assisi, who is quoted in an inscription etched in the stonework of St. Hugh's Langworth.

October 6^{th} - William Tyndale who made an early translation of the Bible into English which formed the model for the Authorised Version of 1611 some 70 years later.

October 10th - Paulinus, a Bishop and Missionary who helped St. Augustine in the evangelization of England, and began the building of a Cathedral at York in the 8th century.

After St. Edward's day, we remember :-October 15th - the 16th century mystic and writer Teresa of Avila.

October 17th - Ignatius of Antioch, martyred in 107 AD.

The 18th October is, of course, St. Luke's Day, who as a New Testament Doctor is closely associated with the Ministry of Healing. In this connection, on that day, the Bishop of Grimsby will be leading a 6.00 p.m. service of celebration of the Church's ministry of Healing at Wrawby Parish Church (near Brigg) which will be "a reflective service including anointing and the laying on of hands". All, especially those with an interest in this ministry, will be welcome.

PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES

NOTES OF THE MEETING OF SUDBROOKE PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON THURSDAY 2ND JULY 2009 IN THE VILLAGE HALL, SUDBROOKE

PRESENT: Councillors Miss R Dobbs (Chair Person), B Bartram, N James, P Rignall, M Dickie, Mrs L Etheridge, S Curtis, I Russell PCSO Jackie Parker, Mrs C Myers (Clerk), Mrs B Solly (Treasurer) 2 parishioners

APOLOGIES: County Councillor S Rawlins

35 PARISHIONERS ITEMS

The following items were raised:-

- 1. That the hedge cutting recently carried out by contractors in Church Lane was incomplete.
- 2. That it may be favourable to have some of the street lights in Church Lane changed to the heritage type lamps. The Clerk was asked to look into this.
- 3. That the lighting at the bus stop on Wragby Road had still not been installed although this had been scheduled for end April. The Clerk would investigate this.
- 4. The Seat in Fox Covert was being lifted by elder. The Clerk would arrange for this to be dealt with.
- 5. The suggestion of a suitable plaque to be sited near to the wood carvings on Scothern Lane depicting that it had been a community project. This would be an agenda item for the September Parish Council

meeting.

6. A request was made for the siting of a marquee adjacent to the Village Hall for a private booking of the Village Hall. No objections were raised to this request.

36 POLICE MATTERS

PCSO Jackie Parker reported on the following:-

- That the hedge between The Dell and the level crossing at Langworth was encroaching on the footway . The Clerk was asked to write to the Highways Officer again about having this cut back.
- A motorbike had been stolen from a property in West Drive.
- A serious incident had occurred of a man exposing himself to two ten year old girls in the woods just away from the Northfield Park area. All schools in the area had been notified and letters sent home to parents. Increased patrols in Sudbrooke were taking place.
- PC Morgan would shortly be taking over the duties of PC Mark Lassmans.

37 DISTRICT COUNCILLORS REPORT

DC Stuart Curtis suggested that it may be possible to share some land with Scothern Parish Council in order that allotments could be provided for parishioners.

However, to date no written requests for allotments had been received for consideration.

It was agreed that the Chair person refer this to the Parish Plan Committee.

<u>38 NOTES OF THE MEETING HELD</u> <u>ON 11TH JUNE 2009</u>

Amendment:- Minute 19 add 'DC S Curtis reported that young saplings on land opposite Northfield Park had been damaged'

Subject to the above the minutes were signed as correct.

39 REPORTS ON MATTERS OUTSTANDING

a) Highway Matters - Debris on verge, Scothern Lane - The landowner had now rolled the grass

verge which had improved the condition.

b) Parish Plan update – a meeting would be held on 14th July 2009.

c) Parish Council insurance

schedule – amendments – The Clerk reported that Cornhill Alliance had confirmed that it was in order to increase the replacement value of the bus shelter opposite the Park Gates to $\pounds4,000$. The Clerk was also instructed to include the Kurling equipment on the schedule.

d) Library Service – The Clerk had been in contact with a representative of the Library Service who had stated that it may be possible to provide a mobile service to the Village Hall at Sudbrooke if a voluntary person would be prepared to oversee it. Members felt that this was not a satisfactory situation and agreed not to pursue it.

40 SPORTSFIELD REPORT

Members reviewed the draft hiring agreement for the use of the sports field and agreed that it be adopted.

It was noted that the sports field was being used for friendly football games which had not been pre-booked by the Club and that these could be held on a first come basis. The £6 bank charges incurred by the parish Council due to the unpaid cheque by the Football Club had still not been reimbursed and the Treasurer would pursue this.

41 SUDBROOKE NEWS

Brian Gardner, General Distributor of the magazine was currently experiencing difficulties with leave and sickness amongst other distributors. Adverts would be placed around the village for relief distributors.

42 PARISH COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVE ON VILLAGE HALL COMMITTEE

Cllr Martin Dickie had now withdrawn from the Village Hall Committee as Parish Council representative following the appointment of Chairman to the Parish Council of Councillor Rose Dobbs, currently Chair person on the Village Hall Committee. Councillor Lynn Etheridge agreed to represent the Parish Council on the Village Hall Committee for the next twelve months.

REPORT OF PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 3RD SEPTEMBER 2009

POLICE MATTERS – Our new PC, Dave Morgan, introduced himself to the meeting. PC Morgan reported that he was following up enquiries about the breaking of a window at the Village Hall and he was hopeful that the culprit would be paying for the damage.

HIGHWAY MATTERS – It was agreed that this subject would now be a regular item on the agenda of Parish Council meetings. (*If any parishioner has any highway matters to report please contact the Clerk or any member of the parish council*).

ALLOTMENTS – Over 20 expressions of interest in taking on an allotment had been received by the Parish Clerk *(This has now risen to nearer 30).* The Parish Council considered the matter and agreed that although the preliminary discussions had been commenced by the Parish Plan Group, due to the involvement of a lease/purchase of land/ finance it was now necessary that the Parish Council continue the control of the item in order to move forward.

The Clerk was asked to liaise with Scothern Parish Council Clerk, WLDC and local landowners with a view to securing some land to share with Scothern Parish Council for allotment use.

The Old Codger.....



I recently took a couple of my grandchildren to the Cinema to see the latest Harry Potter film. I haven't been inside a Picture Palace (as we called them) for years . What a difference I found ...Luxury seating..Huge wide screenAll around sound ...Vivid colours and lush carpeting ..But so small and compact because instead of just one main film being shown there is usually a choice of four or five being shown at the same time in the same building . Other than the person who took your money at

the kiosk there did not appear to be any staff present .Compare that with my memories from years ago.

Going out to the cinema was the main entertainment of the period for almost everyone .It was where you did your courting and kept up to date with who was dating who in your social circle . In most towns there were often four or five cinemas and always seemed to have one which was of a lower standard and was invariably nicknamed The Bug Hutch or the Flea Pit..Usually quite unjustified but occasionally a true indication of condition. There were always two films showing .The main feature , the B movie and a Pathe News piece and often a cartoon featuring Bugs Bunny , Donald Duck or Mickey Mouse....You paid your one and nine pence or two and sixpence (old money)and got a whole packageCourting couples usually paid for the luxury of seats at the rear of the auditorium and slightly more privacy.

On arrival customers were invariably greeted by a majestically clad huge man who wore a bright red frock coat often with a row of medals and a peaked cap. He always looked as though he had just stepped off the parade ground .His job was to manage the lines of intending patrons as they waited to gain admission. In those days the show was non stop so that you may well be shown to your seats half way through a show and watch till the same point was reached again before leavingYou had to be very lucky to watch a film from the beginning to the end....Often you might be allowed to enter and then wait standing up at the back watching the film before a seat became available. Then you would be shown to your seat by a glamorous usherette who walked skilfully backwards down the steep sloping aisle. These young ladies had the job of selling ice cream and other goodies from a tray in the intervals and also kept a stern eye and a penetrating sharp torch beam to cool the ardour of overactive

courting couples in the rear seats.

In the entrance the Manager would stand in his dinner jacket and greet everyone with a smiling welcome and make you feel very important .The other important role of the uniformed commissionaire was to keep a wary eye on the door leading to the toilets where often boys who had paid their entrance money would sneak down and let their friends in from the exit door without payingNot that I ever did that ...?????

Often at the weekend, in selecting which cinema to go to, you would decide on which film would have the smallest queue rather than which film you would rather see. That mattered a great deal on a cold and raining winter evening. It was wonderful to gradually work your way to the front of the queue and hear the magical sound !Two standing one and nines .!. which got you inside out of the elements

In the Interval an organ would rise up out of the floor and you would get a wonderful display of great popular tunes of the days .Those organists really were masters of their craft .

Some films only admitted children if accompanied by an adult and I shudder to thing of the danger I must have unwittingly put myself in by joining the flock of kids loitering outside asking kindly looking strangers toTake me in please Mister .!! Perhaps in those days they didn't have paedophiles ..but if they did we didn't know it. !! A must for all children in those days was Saturday Morning Cinema where for sixpence you would sing-along to songs whose lyrics were shown on the big screen with a bouncing white ball over them. The kids could shout and whistle to their hearts content at the films as Roy Rodgers and his horse Trigger beat up all the baddies ,still keeping his white hat on at all

Unfortunately this month I have to report that there have been four burglaries in the area that we cover from Nettleham Police station. Three at Cherry Willingham, and one in Bardney.

Burglary is a horrendous crime, which has a huge impact on the victims. It is a top priority for Lincolnshire Police to prevent burglaries and to identify and prosecute offenders. Every village is a potential target, please take steps to secure your property;

- Keep car and other keys out of sight. Burglars will use a stick to grab what they can see through a letterbox or cat flap.
- Make sure doors and windows are locked when you are out, and ground floor windows locked at night when you are in bed.
- Look out for your neighbours the best results we get in terms of catching offenders are when a neighbour reports suspicious activity immediately.

As I prepare this report Lincoln CID have arrested two males in regard to a number of burglaries including those at Cherry Willingham. Hopefully I'll have more of an update for you next month.

Also this month all parents of schools in our area will be receiving a letter about parking outside schools. Please read it and park considerately. Some of the parking I have seen defies belief. Please Park legally, safely and with consideration to residents near school. Tickets will be issued....



WELTON FAMILY HEALTH CENTRE

The seasonal 'flu vaccinations are expected at the end of September and we are planning on holding two additional morning clinics on Saturday 3rd and 10th October for those eligible. Please book an appointment at reception if you are in the "at risk" group. We are still waiting for further details on the delivery of the swine 'flu vaccines but will advertise in the surgery when available. Patients registered with this practice who fall outside the defined groups but still wish to have the vaccination may contact Nettleham Surgery on 01522 751717 to arrange a private appointment as practices are unable to offer this service on a private basis to their own registered patients.

The recent national survey of patients indicated that some of our patients would prefer to be able to book appointments further ahead than the present two weeks we offer. In response to this with effect from Monday 5th October '09 we are changing the system to allow up to one third of the daily appointments with a doctor to be booked up to one month ahead. The remaining two thirds are then split between booking 48hrs ahead or on the day which we hope will accommodate the needs of the Sallie Stead

majority of patients. Open access surgery daily between 11 am -midday will remain unchanged.

If any patients have nebulisers which are not being used and belong to the surgery we would appreciate their return.

Dispensary staff report some recent difficulties with patients leaving messages for repeat prescriptions. Please wait until you hear the "bleep" before speaking or we may not be able to process your requirements due to missing information.

We have noticed recently that some of the appointments which have not been kept have been made in advance by patients who have then chosen to use the open access surgery or make an earlier appointment but then failed to cancel their original booking. In August we had 41 patients who failed to cancel or attend their appointments and have 17 reports of hospital appointments not kept. Please help us by ensuring all slots are cancelled if you are unable to attend.
