At the Annual Parochial Church Meeting, Lyn Curtis and John Edmunds were elected Church Wardens, and have since been Admitted to their Offices by the Archdeacon for the coming year. Brian Cardy retired from the PCC and Stephen Kenal was elected in his place, with Jeremy Wallis taking on the balance of his term as a Deanery Representative.

June is going to be quite a busy month with the 'season' of weddings starting, elections on the 4th,and the Lincolnshire Show on the 24th and 25th. Let us hope for some good summer weather – which it certainly is not yet as I write this in mid-May !

A hundred years ago, Pageants were greatly popular in Edwardian England. These involved the staging outside of 'montages' or 'tableaux' of real people (men, women,and children) enacting scenes from English History and English Church History (very often intertwined). Thus, in London the "English Church Pageant" was held in 1909. It is interesting to note that the Prelude featured St.George, St.Alban, St.Ninian, St.David ... and St.German (the patron saint of Scothern Church : sometimes locally spelt Germain).

Locally, on 21st July 1909 in the grounds of Sudbrooke Holme, the "Grand Empire Pageant" was held, involving numerous people. Photographs show that among the presentations were those representing :-1. King Henry VIII, Queen Catherine Howard, and Prince Edward 2. Queen Catherine Howard on horseback with her retinue 3. The Archbishop of Canterbury and the Bishops of Winchester and Coventry

4. Queen Elizabeth I on horseback with Court Ladies

5. Queen Elizabeth's retinue – with 39 people

6. Morris Dancers

7. The Marriage of Rowena and Vortigern

8. Mounted Barons in the time of King John

9. The Signing of Magna Carta
10. The Vicar of Boston rebuking
Dame Smythe for her worldliness
11. Queen Elizabeth with explorers
such as Drake and Frobisher
12. The Landing of Hengist and Horsa (on the lake)

13. A Jester on a Hobby Horse in the time of Queen Elizabeth

14. Cromwell and the Vicar of Boston.

Scenes from National, Empire and Lincolnshire life. A substantial section was devoted to the Pilgrim Fathers their departure and their adventures in the New World.

I imagine a good time was had by one and all who took part and it involved a great number of people in the community. I imagine there was a role for everyone – if they wanted it. Pageants are not so much a feature of our life today as they compete with so many other attractions. Yet, they were clearly a visual part of education about our national life and heritage a hundred years ago, and a community event. Perhaps, they might be fun to create again bringing our history up to date ?

NETTLEHAM MEDICAL PRACTICE NEWS

Thank you to everyone who sponsored members of the practice team taking part in the Lincoln 10k run recently and as a result we were delighted to give the fantastic sum of £605 to Matts Fund.

With effect from 1st June the practice will be providing an anti-coagulation clinic on a Thursday afternoon in the surgery. If you would like to use our services please ask for details at reception. This service is not just limited to our own patients and may be more convenient for others living or working in the area who are not registered with our practice.

Along with the rest of the NHS the practice has been busy working on plans in order to ensure we can respond appropriately in the event of a major outbreak of 'flu. All households should have received a booklet from the Sallie Stead Dept of Health advising what action to

take in the event of such a problem and we will work closely with NHS Lincolnshire and other practices to put services into place in the event of a pandemic declaration. Some patients will be aware that we have removed toys, magazines etc from the waiting room this is hopefully a short term measure but as we are currently on a Level 5 pandemic alert this is a precautionary measure in an attempt to kerb infections being transmitted in our waiting area.

36 patients did not attend for booked surgery appointments during April and we were advised of 11 failing to keep hospital appointments. Please help us to cut down the number of missed appointments where possible so that others can use them



Volunteer Driver's Scheme

As a resident of the village of Sudbrooke it is reasonably safe to assume that you are also a registered patient at Nettleham Medical Practice and on occasions have a necessity to visit either the surgery in Lodge Lane Nettleham or at The Parade in Cherry Willingham. When this occurs how do you get from your house to the surgery, maybe you have your own vehicle and can drive there, or you may ask one of your neighbours if they would be prepared to take you, or you could call the local taxi service.

If you do not have your own transport, are you aware that the practice operates **a volunteer driver's scheme** who are prepared to collect you from your house, take you to the surgery, wait whilst you have your appointment with the doctor or the nurse (which a taxi firm will not do) and then take you home again. A service like this does not come free and a nominal amount is charged which covers the cost of petrol/diesel and any wear and tear on the driver's vehicle.

There are two of these volunteer drivers living in the village and between them they are currently available Monday or Tuesday and Thursday or Friday and if you have an appointment at either of the surgeries all you have to do is ask the receptionist at the surgery when you make your appointment to arrange for transport to be made available for you to get to the surgery.

As a rough guide if your appointment was at Nettleham surgery you would be asked to pay between £2.50 and £3.00 for the service or if you had to go to Cherry Willingham you would be asked to pay between £3.90 and £4.20 for the service. These rates compare very favourably with local taxi services and bear in mind they will not wait for you.

There are other drivers living in other villages who would cover if your appointment happened to be on a Wednesday but as they would have to travel from their home to Sudbrooke and return to their home afterwards the cost would be slightly higher.

If you would like to make use of this service just ask the receptionist when making your appointment.
