1 PARISHIONERS ITEMS

It was noted that a tree on the verge in Holme Drive had been severely cut back by a resident. It was noted that the trees on the verges are the property of the County Council and as such requests should be made to them when trimming is required.

The 5 aside goal posts had been moved from the playing field onto the multi-purposed playing area, preventing tennis players using the court. Members agreed to move them back to the playing field.

It was noted that several boards around the multi-purpose play area required replacing. The Clerk was asked to obtain a price for this work.

2 APPOINTMENT OF CHAIRMAN

Councillor Peter Heath was proposed by Councillor Martin Dickie as Chair-

man for the forthcoming year, seconded by Councillor Stuart Curtis.

Councillor Heath agreed to this appointment and signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office.

3 APPOINTMENT OF VICE CHAIRMAN

Councillor Bob Waller offered to take on this role, following which he was proposed by Councillor Stuart Curtis, seconded by Councillor Peter Heath.

Councillor Waller duly signed his Declaration of Acceptance of Office.

4 POLICE MATTERS

It was reported that the police were aware of vehicles using the village hall car park during the evenings as a meeting place.

5 DISTRICT COUNCILLORS REPORT

DC Stuart Curtis reported a quiet few weeks within the District Council. He further added that the Central Lincs Allocation Document would shortly be passed to Parish Councils for comments.

6 NOTES OF MEETING HELD ON 4TH APRIL 2013

These were signed as a correct record.

7 SUDBROOKE WOODS FOOT- PATHS – report

The Chairman suspended orders between 8.00pm and 8.10pm to allow Mr Richard Drabble to join in the discussion, on behalf of the Sudbrooke Woods Footpaths Committee.

Concern had been expressed by the

new landowners that the Notices served upon them for the Rights of Way were not in their names. The Parish Council were assured by Mr Drabble that this was to no detriment and that in the meantime negotiations could go ahead with the landowners.

It was felt that in view of the new Central Lincs Allocation Document shortly being produced it would be advisable for the landowners to lodge their intentions of the land and in this respect Councillors Martin Dickie and Peter Heath would contact them.

8 REPORTS ON MATTERS OUT-STANDING

- a) Transfer of land – Beech Close – The acquisition of the piece of land had completed on 26th March 2013.
- b) Siting of Seats – Beech Close/ Jubilee Garden – Quotations – Two quotations had been received (a) in the sum of £1243.00 (b) in the sum of £850, this being for the siting only. An additional quotation for the metal fixing rods had been prepared by Mr Dave Etheridge at a cost of £163.20.

Proposed by Cllr Martin Dickie that quotation (b) be accepted in the sum of £850 plus the quotation from Mr Dave Etheridge at a cost of £163.20. Seconded by Councillor Stuart Curtis.

- c) Obstruction to Highway, Church Lane – A site meeting had been held between the owner and legal representatives of Lincolnshire County Council.

9 FENCING/PURCHASE OF REMOVABLE BOLLARD FOR AREA BETWEEN VILLAGE HALL CAR PARK AND PLAYING FIELD

Following problems with cars driving on to the playing field the Clerk was asked to obtain a price for the erection of Lincolnshire post and rail fencing for the area between the Village Hall and the hedge. A suitable gap for emergency vehicles and the grass cutting machinery would be required to be left. A removable bollard was available from Greetwell Parish Council at a cost of £60 which would prevent vehicles entering the field when in place.

Members agreed that the bollard be purchased from Greetwell Parish Council.

10 HIGHWAY MATTERS

No further information was available on the closure dates of Church Lane.

11 SUDBROOKE NEWS – RESIGNATION OF EDITOR/ ADVERTISING MANAGER

Mr Nick Truscott, Editor of Sudbrooke News had tendered his resignation to take effect from the end of August. Members agreed that he had done a sterling job in producing the magazine. The post would be advertised.

12 PLANNING

- a) **Report of informal meeting with Simon Sharp (WLDC Planning Department) and Paul Truelove** – It was understood that LCC Highways Department were objecting to a footpath/cycleway along the stretch of Sudbrooke/Nettleham Lane due to it not being possible to continue it to the church. Members felt strongly

that any footpath along that stretch of lane was better than none and that negotiations should continue.

b) Applications

- I. 15 Greenway – 129866 – Two storey side extension – Comments – It is understood that neighbours have concern over possible loss of light at the rear of their property. This is a large extension and due to the size it is suggested that a condition that no further Permitted Development Rights be allowed without the consent of the Planning Authority.
 - II. Willowside, West Drive – 129815 – No objections.
 - III. Park Farm – 129869 – Erection of permanent agricultural worker's dwelling, garage and formation of private drive.— Objections in that it is considered that there is no essential need for an agricultural dwelling in this location. The proposed dwelling is too large in comparison to other agricultural dwellings.
- c) Permission – The Hyde, 4 Poachers Lane – 129575

14 CHAIRMANS COMMENTS

Councillor Peter Heath thanked members for his election to Chairman. He thanked Councillor Martin Dickie for carrying out the Chairman's duties for the last year.

The Chairman informed members that he and Councillor Martin Dickie had

attended a Training seminar at Coningsby organised by LALC which had proved very informative.

15 CORRESPONDENCE

Request by LCC to join Consultation Database - Circulated to members.

Request for letter of support for swimming pool/fitness centre – William Farr C of E Comprehensive School – Members agreed to support this project but would not be able to incur any financial commitment to it.

Request for donation – Lincoln and Lindsey Blind Society – Members felt unable to make a donation on behalf of residents agreeing that donations were a personal choice.

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BRIEF REPORT OF PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 6 JUNE 2013

Two important items were discussed which are reported on more fully below – the Central Lincolnshire Local Plan and tree felling in Sudbrooke Woods.

BEST KEPT VILLAGE COMPETITION – The village has entered into the competition again this year and judging will commence at the end of June. By the time the magazine reaches you the play equipment at the Village Hall should have been painted and the carved seats sited in the Jubilee Garden, Beech Close.

CENTRAL LINCOLNSHIRE LOCAL PLAN - *Stuart Curtis, District/Parish Councillor*

The allocation document showing potential development sites over the next 20 years across Central Lincolnshire - covering the whole of North Kesteven, West Lindsey and the City of Lincoln has been issued to all Parish Councils for consultation up to September.

Central Lincolnshire's emerging development plan focuses a significant portion of growth in and around Lincoln, Gainsborough and Sleaford but also allows for a smaller amount of growth within the rural parts of Central Lincolnshire. It is important to plan ahead for future growth; making sure the right choices are made to maximise benefits and maintain viable, vibrant Communities - where shops, schools, pubs and transport can be sustained.

It is therefore important to engage with local residents to find out what issues are important locally and what opportunities should be explored.

A number of POTENTIAL sites have been identified for Sudbrooke and the Parish Council have arranged a special Public meeting to be held on Thursday 22nd August 2013 in the Village Hall, Sudbrooke, commencing at 6.30pm.

FELLING LICENCE FOR SOME TREES IN SUDBROOKE WOODS – Peter Heath

The Parish Council was advised by the West Lindsey Tree Preservation Officer that the new owner of Sudbrooke Woods and Park Area wanted to carry out maintenance work on the woodland.

The Chairman - Peter Heath, and Councillor Ian Russell were invited by the Officer to attend, as observers, a meeting between herself and the company contracted to carry out the work.

The meeting was very informative. The company, UPM Tillhill, has a nationwide presence and reputation for sympathetic treatment of wooded areas. We were informed that the work required was to thin out some of the dense tree growth to allow the remaining woodland to improve. Areas such as the ponds have been allowed to become silted up through the high canopy of trees that now grow close to the banks. By removing some of the trees, new lower growth will return and thus encourage wild life and the ponds to recover their vitality. The overall objective is to revitalise a neglected area.

Because of the nature of the work Lincolnshire County Council will have to agree to a temporary closure of the footpaths for the protection of the public. The owners of the land are completely within their rights to carry out this work and, if carried out as described, it will enhance the woodland and improve the area for wildlife. The Parish Council is seeking to meet with the new owners to discuss not only the future of the woods but also the potential development of the greater area of The Park.

ROAD CLOSURE – CHURCH LANE - This will inevitably cause some disruption to residents living in Church Lane but it is understood that the work is essential and must be carried out.

The contractors have agreed to work as best they can with residents and Councillor Bob Waller has offered to act as liaison between residents and the contractors so if there are any issues give Bob a ring on 01522 753017 and he will see what he can do.

RE: SUDBROOKE WOODS FELLING APPLICATION

It was good to meet on site last Thursday to discuss the proposed work to be undertaken within the woodland at Sudbrooke Park.

Mr Wilkinson had approached UPM Tilhill having recently secured the sale of the woodlands with a view to improve their overall condition. From observation and discussion it is apparent that the woods have gone unmanaged for some time and are overdue for some intervention. Mr Wilkinson has indicated he was keen to improve the value of the woodland in terms of silviculture and biodiversity; it is in this capacity that I have been involved.

Forest management is important to maximise the potential of the woodland and enhance the environmental, economic and social benefits. It provides the opportunity to create and maintain habitat diversity and manage health and safety to public rights of way. Forest management also ensures the longevity of the woodlands and the sustainability of a natural resource.

Broadleaf woodlands in particular were prone to neglect due to the lack of attractive markets but with the sharp increase in demand for firewood a lot have been brought under management. Landowners are also less likely to clear woodland for other uses when they have an enhanced value.

The plan at Sudbrooke at this stage is to undertake an initial thin to remove any hazardous trees, reduce the canopy to the edge of the ponds and from the over stocked areas. This will increase light levels to the forest floor improving ground flora and water quality. The thinnings will be sold into the firewood market.

Before works commence there is a need to assess the impact of our work on the wildlife; undertaking checks to identify sensitive habitats and potential roosting sites. This is part of our responsibility in fulfilling conditions of the felling licence and the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (Amended). Any veteran trees or nesting sites will be monitored and recorded to avoid disturbance.

Welton Family Health Centre

Last year we surveyed patients about our appointment system and in particular the open access surgeries we have been running between 11 – midday for many years. We discussed the results with our Patient Group and as a result agreed that we would move this surgery to start earlier in the day. It has not been possible to implement this due to maternity leave so far, but we are now planning to start these changes on Monday 2nd September.

Each weekday morning we will run a surgery for anyone who turns up between **8.30 – 9.00 am** for acute problems and they will be seen by one of the doctors or nurse practitioner. This surgery is **not** for regular reviews of long term conditions, medication reviews, or multiple problems. The aim is to enable anyone who feels the need to see a doctor on that day, due to an acute illness or problem, to be able to do so. Anyone attending after 9.00am who needs to be seen will be referred to the duty doctor on call, who may call the patient to discuss the matter on the telephone or offer an appointment slot, depending upon the circumstances. Booked appointments with all doctors will then run during the day from 11 am.

We aim to increase the amount of pre-bookable appointments offered to patients by the introduction of this system and also hope to allow online booking for those who are interested in making appointments this way. We hope this will also alleviate some of the problems of patients trying to get through to the surgery when the `phone lines open and give options to those who wish to see a doctor before going to school or work in a morning. Appointment slots will be released for booking up to four weeks ahead and also 48 hrs in advance as well as a small number on the day. In addition, we are offering more telephone consultation slots which may be pre-booked as feedback suggests this is a valued service for patients.

We are also introducing more doctor and nurse led clinics for the on- going management of long term conditions and increasing the availability of smoking cessation support and phlebotomy clinics.

To ensure that routine reviews of long term conditions (e.g. diabetes, hypertension) are carried out appropriately, patients are required to attend prior to their appointment for routine blood tests so that they may be discussed at the review appointment.

More details will be available in the surgery throughout the summer months and we welcome feedback from patients once introduced.

IT Speak

Hi Folks,

Building Your Own PC—8

Once you've made yourself static-safe, place the unwrapped system board on the table and fit the processor and the heat sink. Then fit the RAM. Take care to apply gentle and careful pressure when fitting the processor heat sink, fan and RAM. The next step is to carefully fit the system board into the case, resting the board on the stand-offs and installing the screws. There is no specific order in which the rest of the components are fitted; it all depends on space and component size. The power supply (if not pre-fitted) could go in next followed by the graphics card. Then add the Solid State Drive (SSD)/ Hard Disk Drive (HDD) and optical drives. There may be other components that you added to your list so fit these.

Next comes the fun part — fitting the cables to the right sockets. Cables are very specific which way round they fit, often keyed, so ensure you align cables correctly before applying any pressure. This is where the connection map you made comes in very useful. The SSD/HDD that is going to be the boot drive should be

connected to SATA-0 or a dedicated SSD connector if one is provided and an SSD is to be used. This will generally become your C Drive. The optical drive, either CD, DVD or Blu-Ray, is generally connected to SATA-1 and any other drives connected to other SATA connectors. This order can be changed but this is normally the realm of the experts. If you decided to fit a Floppy Disk Drive (FDD) for backward compatibility reasons, your system board should have a dedicated connector. Fit the system board power cables; modern boards require 2 or 3 and is detailed in the manual. Connect the drive power cables and the graphics card power cable if required. Any fans will need connecting to power, either directly to the power supply or to connectors on the system board.

The case will have a set of cables that fit on the system board to connect the power switch, drive activity lights, USB and SATA ports and the front audio sockets. These fit to very specific pins or sockets on the system board and the manual will tell you which ones and which way round they should be fitted.
